ew Mexico is filled with wonder. The state slogan is "The Land of Enchantment," and it couldn't be closer to the truth. I was awestruck from the moment I hopped off the plane. As a Midwesterner, experiencing Albuquerque was like entering a new world completely absent of familiar green foliage and thick, oppressive humidity. The rocky desert terrain is dotted with adobe-style homes on a horizon that meets an expansive, blue, cloudless sky. Its natural beauty is quite obvious, but there is a palpable energy about the land that makes it feel even more enchanting.

Autumn in New Mexico is an especially magical time of year. It's when the red and green chilies are roasted, filling the air with a warm aroma of charred peppers. It's when professional balloonists travel from near and far to fill the sky with a kaleidoscope of colorful hot air balloons. It's a sight to behold and completely worthy of adding to your bucket list. Seriously, start planning your September or October adventure now. The air is crisp, the culture is rich and the history is deep. New Mexico is truly a place for the outdoor seekers of wanderlust.











ALBUQUERQUE INTERNATIONAL BALLOON FIESTA

The Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta is the largest hot air balloon festival in the world. This nineday event takes place every October in a large open field surrounded by the Sandia Mountains. The festival features balloons lit from within to light up the night and exciting balloon races and rodeos, but the most spectated event is the mass ascension. At sunrise, hundreds of hot air balloons coordinate a simultaneous lift-off. The best part? Standing in the midst of these massive beauties as they lift weightlessly. Picture the glow of the rising sun on the horizon lighting up the Sandia Mountains as a rainbow of balloons lift off, literally right over your head.

SANDIA PEAK SKI & TRAMWAY

The Sandias are a chain of mountains on the eastern side of Albuquerque. Sandia is Spanish for watermelon and as the sun sets, the mountains take on a bright pink hue—watermelon mountains. The Tramway is a fun way to take advantage of the expansive views from the Sandia Peaks. It takes about 15 minutes to

travel from the base of the mountain to the peak, but the ride itself is exciting as you travel nearly three miles over the canyons with birds-eye views of flora and fauna. The dramatic panorama of New Mexico's landscape stretches as far as the eyes can see. There's also a full bar and restaurant on the Tramway perfect for taking it all in.

ACOMA PUEBLO

Often called "Sky City," Acoma Pueblo is the oldest inhabited community in America. Built upon a 367-foot sandstone bluff, Acoma Pueblo allows visitors to immerse themselves in Native American culture. Tour the authentic tribal dwellings, none of which have running water, electricity or sewer systems. The homes are typically 3-story, apartment-style buildings made of adobe mud brick. Each level is connected by ladder and many buildings are accented with bright bursts of turquoise trim. Traditional Acoma pottery is dotted throughout the community, displaying bold geometric patterns. Walking through the ancient community is a truly surreal experience. It's like walking backwards in time.





Easy BAKED EGGS

2 free range eggs

Parmesan cheese (freshly grated)

2 basil leaves

2 ramekins

DIRECTIONS


Preheat oven to 425-degrees.


Spray ramekins. Spread pasta sauce in the bottom of your oven-safe dishes. Dollop with cottage cheese. Tear basil and scatter. Break two eggs on top. Season with salt and pepper. Grate parmesan on top.

Bake for 15 minutes. Yolks should still be runny.

MAKE A LIST

This is the best part of the planning process because it's full of fun words like vision, possibility and potential. Write down your home improvement goals for both the interior and exterior. MARK YOUR CALENDAR

MAKE A BUDGET

Assign a rough cost to each project on your list. Budget funds based on the high end of your estimates. You don't want to start a project and run out of funds to complete it.

very Easter season, people across the globe hard-boil eggs and dye them bright, vibrant colors. There are many ways to dye an Easter egg, but if you really want to impress family and friends this year, try this trick: silk tie-dyed Easter eggs.

This is the perfect up-cycle crafting project. You use fabric on hand, the kids get to raid Dad's closet and the result is a batch of beautiful eggs, perfect for display. Think Fabergé!

SUPPLIES

- Several 100% silk ties
- A clean white cotton T-shirt
- A handful of twist ties and rubber bands
- A dozen raw eggs
- Distilled white vinegar
- Seam ripper
- Tongs
- Stock pot

INSTRUCTIONS

Using your seam ripper, remove the seams and the lining in your silk ties. You will only need the silk.

Cut the widest part of the tie into a square big enough to completely cover the egg.

Place the raw egg gently within the silk square. Wrap the silk around the egg. Seal the silk with a twist tie to create a silk pouch.

Wrap each pouch in white cotton T-shirt material and secure with a rubber band.

Place the eggs in a pot and prepare to boil. Make sure each egg is completely submerged. Add 3 Tablespoons of distilled white vinegar to the water. Boil for 30 minutes.

Remove your eggs from the boiling water with tongs. Cool for 30 minutes. Unwrap each egg to reveal perfectly colored silk tie-dyed eggs!




